THANKS TO CARTER MONTROSS FOR HIS PRESENTATION LAST WEEK AT ALL THE MASSES....

A brief summary for those who were not in attendance last weekend: (1) the parish income is \$600 less per week than what is needed to meet expenses; (2) 580 parishioners out of 1,300+ have offering envelopes and 242 are used on a regular basis; (3) one suggested method of contributing to the parish is known as EFT (Electronic fund transfer); [Pamphlets were available in the church seats for parishioners to take with them. EFT allows people to make donations without writing a check or putting cash in envelopes. Many people already use this method to pay bills.]

Mr. Montross urged parishioners to try and increase weekly offerings by \$2, \$3 or \$5, to meet the current shortfall. He re-stated information published in recent bulletins that several extraordinary projects for the church, convent and rectory were paid by savings which has come from the generous donations of people who had remembered Sacred Heart parish in their Wills.

He concluded his remarks by encouraging parishioners to support Sacred Heart parish as good stewards of the blessings God has bestowed on all.
