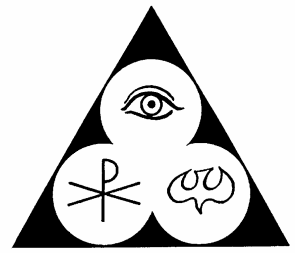

Religious Education

As the religious education 'school year' comes to a close, we extend to each of our Catechists and aides a heartfelt "Thank You!" for the time, talent, and treasure they have shared with the junior members of our parish family. Parents, now and again throughout the summer, sit down with your child and the textbook that is theirs to keep, and review some of the Bible stories that were read and discussed this past year. Go over prayers that were memorized, beatitudes or commandments or church precepts that were learned. Close your at-home catechetical session by reading one of the closing prayers at the end of every chapter, and pray for all of our parish catechists who help you, the primary educators of your child's faith life.

Profile of a Catechist

The Catechist is a person who:

- 1) is called to teach in the name of the Church
- 2) speaks from the depths of their own personal faith journey
- 3) lives a deeply spiritual and religious life
- 4) witnesses a life of prayer
- 5) opens his or her heart and mind to the Word of God in the Scriptures
- 6) has a deep love for the Church and her teachings
- 7) Lives in communion with the Church and embraces a full sacramental life
- 8) possesses the unambiguous commitment to convey the truths of the faith in a clear and consistent manner
- 9) pursues the necessary training in theology, religious education and catechetical methodology to effectively teach the heart and mind of Christ to his/her students
- 10) participates in the social and charitable ministries of the Church

From the Encyclical Ecclesia de Eucharistia

37. The two sacraments of the Eucharist and Penance are very closely connected. Because the Eucharist makes present the redeeming sacrifice of the Cross, it naturally gives rise to a continuous need for conversion... If a Christian's conscience is burdened by serious sin, then the path of penance through the sacrament of Reconciliation becomes necessary for full participation in the Eucharistic Sacrifice.

The judgment of one's state of grace obviously belongs only to the person involved, since it is a question of examining one's conscience. However, in cases of outward conduct which is seriously, clearly and steadfastly contrary to the moral norm, the Church, in her pastoral concern for the good order of the community and out of respect for the sacrament, cannot fail to feel directly involved. The *Code of Canon Law* refers to this situation of a manifest lack of proper moral disposition when it states that those who "obstinately persist in manifest grave sin" are not to be admitted to Eucharistic communion.

From Pope John Paul II

31. We have before us the example of the Saints, who in the Eucharist found nourishment on their journey towards perfection. How many times did they shed tears of profound emotion in the presence of this great mystery, or experience hours of inexpressible "spousal" joy before the sacrament of the altar! —*from the Apostolic Letter: Stay with us, Lord, 10/7/04*

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

1375 St. John Chrysostom declares: "It is not man that causes the (bread and wine) offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. 'This is my body,' he says. This word transforms the things offered." ...

1376 The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation."
