Memorial Day Mass: 9:00am

Tomorrow, May 30 Mass is scheduled for 9:00am. Even if you can't join us, please make sure to observe it as a **Day of Memorial**. (And, remember to set aside Nov 2 the Church's "memorial day," *All Souls Day*.) Allow this Memorial Day to be a spiritual pilgrimage. Here is a prayer you might say **at the cemetery**:

May this place, prepared in the sure hope of the resurrection, never cease to remind us of the life that we are to share in Christ, who will transform our earthly bodies to be like his in glory. (now recall your departed loved ones, mindful of everyone buried there.)

ST. JOHN CEMETERY PRICES: Every year, the Cemetery Board and our Finance Council look at our cemetery costs to determine prices for the new fiscal year (beginning July 1.) The Finance Council recommended (in 2000) that we raise prices 3-5% every year to keep up with rising costs, in view the pricing recommendations of the Catholic Cemeteries Association, and especially in view of the low reserves we have compared to the requirements of the CCA and of state law. However, the Cemetery Board has recommended we keep the same prices we've had since 2002. So, there will be no increase in grave or opening prices this year.

**The Hospital Will Not Tell Your Priest
That You Have Been Admitted.**

Thankfully *Butler Hospital* will continue to ask at admission whether you would like to see a priest. If you answer "yes," then both priests and Eucharistic Ministers will be permitted to visit. But, please be aware that admission through the Emergency Room may often omit such questions to deal more promptly with the medical emergency.

While Butler Hospital will continue to ask regular admissions if they would like to see their priest/minister/rabbi, this will **not** be the case at all hospitals and nursing homes because of the *Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act* which became effective April 4, 2003.

If you, or a family member, are hospitalized or enter a long-term care facility, please call the parish office with the person's name, medical facility, and room number. Otherwise, the patient or resident will not be able to receive the sacraments. Hospitals and medical facilities are limited by law what information they can provide.

For planned hospital stays, it is always best to receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick beforehand.

Envisioning Ministry with One Less Priest

Our neighbor from N. Oakland, Fr. Steven Neff, began to consider being ordained (last Saturday) when his parish began sharing a priest in the early 1990s. Expect many more reassignments and more shared priests when the Envisioning Ministry process culminates in the next few months.
