sophisticated(3)-experienced in worldly way  
aloofness(3)-the state of being uninterested  
elite(3)-superior; top  
resignedly(3)-patiently accepting  
ember(3)-a glowing piece of wood, coal, etc.  
apprehensive(4)-anxious or fearful; uneasy  
defiance(4)-bold resistance to authority  
contemptuous(4)-scornful; despising  
sheepish(4)-acting embarrassed or ashamed  
premonition(4)-a feeling that something is about to occur

radiate(7)-to send out rays; to beam or shine  
delinquents(7)-kids who commit crimes  
manslaughter(7)-kill without advance plans  
brawn(7)-strength; physical power  
recurring(7)-occurring again and again  
aghast(7)-shocked; horrified; terrified  
exploit(7)-daring act or heroic deed  
faltered(8)-spoke hesitantly; stammered  
jet(8)-black; usually highly polished  
divert(8)-draw to another direction

idolized(11)-adored; worshipped;  
hearing(11)-appearance in front of a judge  
guardian(11)-one who watches over another  
liable(11)-likely  
flinching(12)-withdrawing or shrinking from  
vacuum(12)-state of emptiness; void  
veered(12)-shift from one direction to other  
welled(12)-gushed up  
vast(12)-great in size or scope  
acquitted(12)-set free after evidence has been considered
