DON'T MISS THE POINT

"But seek first the Kingdom of God. . ." (Matt. 6:33)

Have you ever tried to explain something to someone and they completely misunderstood what you were trying to say? That was the problem Jesus was having in today's gospel. He had just returned from feeding the 5,000, and many from that multitude were following Him because He fed them. Jesus confronts them about this: ***"Amen, amen, I say to you, you are looking for me not because you saw signs, but because you ate the loaves and were filled."*** In essence, Jesus said, "I did this miracle to show you that I'm the Messiah that you've been waiting for, but all you saw was free food. You missed the point." The point, Jesus says, is ". . . do not work for food that perishes. . ." In more modern terms, he said don't work for a bigger house and a better car or steaks on the grill. These things satisfy temporarily. Once we have the bigger house and the better car and the steak dinner, tomorrow or next week, we'll see a bigger house or a newer car that we want. And, that steak from the supermarket won't be good enough. We'll need steaks from organic, grass-fed beef that's been aged. The flesh is **NEVER** satisfied and things of this earth fall down, break down and spoil.

Jesus says we should work for "food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you." The Jews then bring up the manna their ancestors ate in the desert, thinking this is what Jesus must mean, that He was going to give them heavenly bread like manna. They were still thinking about their stomachs. Jesus corrects them: ***". . . my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."***

This sounded good to the Jews. ***"Sir, give us this bread always."*** They still think there's free food involved, that Jesus was there to satisfy their fleshly desires. I suppose there was a lot of disappointment in the crowd when Jesus said, ***"I am the bread of life."*** Their minds were set on this temporal life and making it easier and better, but Jesus came to point them to and prepare them for eternity. And, that's what scripture, which is the **Bread of Life and the Word of God**, is to do for us. It points us toward Jesus and our eternal existence, where food is not an issue (***"Man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God."*** Matt. 4:4); where clothing is not an issue (***"He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments . . ."*** Rev. 3:5); where houses are not an issue (***"In my Father's house are many mansions. . ."*** John 13:2).

So, when we find ourselves concerned about earthly things, we need to follow the advice of **Matt. 6: 33**: ***"Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you."*** This is the key to everlasting happiness. Peace & Blessings,
