BE AN IMITATOR OF CHRIST

"Be imitators of God, as beloved children and live in love. . ." (Eph. 5:1)

When I was growing up, I wanted to be like Superman. I wanted to leap tall buildings and be a hero, but mostly I wanted to fly. The best I was ever able to do was jump off a chair and land on my feet.

In today's reading we're asked to imitate God. If I couldn't manage to be like Superman, how am I going to be like God? Well, the good news is that He doesn't expect us to fly or develop x-ray vision. He does expect us not to *"grieve the Holy Spirit of God. . ."* which means we should, *"Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor and evil speaking be put away. . ."* from us. That's a lot simpler than leaping a tall building in a single bound.

It might be simpler, but it's not always easy because our flesh wants its own way. It's our sin nature that will prevent us from *"being kind to one another, compassionate, and forgiving one another"*, but this is what we are to strive to achieve through crucifying the flesh.

In the church, we have two examples of people who have become imitators of God. The first is St. Clare of Assisi, founder of the order of Poor Clares, and a close friend of St. Francis, who was her inspiration. St. Clare endured many years suffering great pains, but she said that no pain could trouble her because of her great joy in serving the Lord. Her feast day is August 11.

The second Saint is Maximilian Kolbe, a Polish Franciscan priest imprisoned in 1941 and sent to the concentration camp at Auschwitz. On July 31 of that year, in reprisal for one prisoner's escape, ten men were chosen to die. One of the young men was a husband and father. Fr. Kolbe offered to take his place. He died two weeks later from starvation and thirst. His feast day is August 14.

This does not mean we must become suffering saints to please God. However, we do need to put aside our own feelings and agendas and put others first. That's how we become conformed to God's image. Then others see God living in us and through us and want what we have. We don't need to be faster than a speeding bullet, just quick to love and forgive.
