MISSIONARY VISIT

This is the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time and next, Sunday, July 18-19, Fr. John Omboga of the Diocese of Ngong in Kenya, East Africa, will be visiting our churches and preaching at all masses.

The 29-parish diocese that he is from has 120,000 Catholic converts who are mostly small-scale farmers. The general population of the diocese consists of the Maasai people who are polygamists. An effort to evangelize these people is being made by a team of priests and 380 trained and 180 untrained catechists.

Through his theme of “*Empower the Catechists to Evangelize*”, Fr. Omboga is hoping to raise funds for these catechists that will help to provide additional remuneration, purchase of bicycles for transportation, create a revolving fund to assist their families and start income-generating projects to help them become self-sustaining in the future.

In today’s reading in Jeremiah, God says, “*I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble.*” And, in the gospel, we see Jesus, tired and worn from constant ministry, seeking a quiet place but finding that the people still followed Him. Mark tells us that “*His heart was moved with pity for them for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and He began to teach them many things.*”

We, as a church, have an opportunity to send shepherds and teachers to those who have never heard the gospel. Without our support, these catechists will be unable to fulfill the call of God in their lives. Please open your hearts and give generously to this appeal and know that you can never out-give God who “*loves a cheerful giver*” (2 Cor. 9:7).

The Social Ministry Committees from both churches want to remind you that we are still collecting items for the **Migrant Farm Workers and their Children.**

Saint Hyacinth Church will be collecting items until July 12. The items include: Household Linens; Kitchenware, including pots and pans and dishes; Small Appliances, such as radios, fans, small refrigerators; Clothing for men, women and children; Food Items, including granola bars, packages of cookies and crackers, fruit and applesauce cups, pudding cups, microwave pop corn, juice boxes and bottled water.
