PARISH MISSION

Fr. Deusdedit Byomuhangi will be speaking to us on the weekend of July 27, 28. Fr comes from the Diocese of Kabale, Uganda and the following highlights what his Mission Appeal is for.

Kabale Diocese is located in the rural South Western part of Uganda which occupies an area of about 2,060 sq miles. It has a total population of 1,727,217 of which 778,544 (45%) are Roman Catholics and the majority of the rest of the population are protestants.

Due to HIV/AIDS pandemic, malaria and poverty, Kabale Diocese is faced with a challenge of many orphans, child headed families and so many families which still live in abject poverty. Many of these orphans have lost the parents and find themselves on their own or living with grandparents who hardly support them. It is entirely churches, especially through the diocese, parishes and Parish Centers or Sub Parishes to do whatever they can to build schools, health units so that these children can have access to medical care, and education. The diocese cannot ignore the plight of these unfortunate children who cannot afford tuition fees, medical care and other basic necessities of life. The mission appeal is therefore intended to seek for financial help and support for these orphans and many other poor children, to give them some hope by providing them with the basic necessities of life, medical care, shelter and education opportunities. The goal of all this is to give these tools they need to support and sustain themselves. You are welcome to be part of this mission through your financial support and prayers.

Living Will: A Living Will tells your health care professional whether you want death-delaying procedures used if you have a terminal condition and are unable to state your wishes. A living will, unlike a health care power of attorney, only applies if you have a terminal condition. A terminal condition means an incurable and irreversible condition such that death is imminent and that application of any death delaying procedures serves only to prolong the dying process.

Even if you sign a living will, food and water cannot be withdrawn if it would be the only cause of death. Also, if you are pregnant and your health-care professional thinks you could have a live birth your living will cannot go into effect.

You can use a standard living will or write your own. You may write specific directions about death-delaying procedures you do or do not want.

Two people must witness your signing of the living will. Your health-care professional cannot be a witness. It is your responsibility to tell your health-care professional if you have a living will if you are able to do so.

You can cancel your living will at any time, either by telling someone or by canceling it in writing. If you have both a health care power of attorney and a living will, the agent you name in your power of attorney will make your health-care decisions unless he or she is unavailable.
