



## BISHOP OF GALLOWAY

Dear Father,

It is now five years since Pope Francis published his encyclical *Laudato Si'* urging us to care for our common home. The encyclical highlights the urgent need for us to heal our relationship with creation and with each other.

As Scotland eases out of lockdown, may I remind you of the Season of Creation which runs from 1 September (World Day of Prayer for Creation) to 4 October (Feast of St Francis of Assisi).

This is an opportunity for all of us to pray, reflect and respond to the challenging words of Pope Francis: "What kind of world do we want to leave to those who come after us, to children who are now growing up?" (LS, 160)

As the pandemic and the climate crisis rage on, now more than ever we must respond to the "cry of the earth and the cry of the poor" (LS, 49), conscious that our brothers and sisters in the world's poorest communities have done least to contribute to the ecological crisis but are already bearing the brunt of its consequences.

I invite you to consider initiating the Season of Creation with a *Laudato Si'* Mass. Liturgical resources for Mass, bulletin announcements and other useful materials to assist you are available online at [www.seasonofcreation.org/catholic/](http://www.seasonofcreation.org/catholic/).

In order to overcome the coronavirus pandemic we have been forced these past few months to change our way of life, may we now be prepared to make the deep and long-term changes that are necessary to avoid ecological disaster and to care for our common home.

May we remember each other in our prayers, particularly the poor who are already suffering the consequences of climate change.
