**NURSE'S CORNER**

**What is the Definition of Blood Pressure?** Blood pressure is the measurement of the force of blood against vessel walls as it flows through the arteries. Blood pressure measurements are one of the main vital signs because blood pressure is an indication of various conditions, including overall health. The heart is always in a cycle of pumping and resting. As the heart pumps, it circulates blood throughout the body via arteries. During the resting phase of the heart, blood is returning to the heart through veins. The heart uses force to circulate the blood throughout the body, this force is measured as blood pressure. When taking your pressure the healthcare provider listens for the first time your heartbeat is audible and the last time your heart beat is audible. The top number, the diastolic pressure, represents the force of the blood against your artery walls when the heart is resting—or between beats. According to the American Heart Association healthy blood pressure reading is considered 119/79. (article written by Lee Woodard, contributor to eHow Health).
