NURSE'S CORNER: Disasters do occur. With spring comes tornadoes. Be prepared. Take warnings seriously. Sirens save lives. With the new advances in weather radar more precise forecasting is possible. Make a plan and practice. On-line courses are available or contact the American Red Cross for information. Make plans to evacuate your pets. Don't leave pets behind; get them before they hide. A pillow case makes a good pet carrier. The American Red Cross recommends having the following emergency supplies on hand in a "go-bag". Flashlight, battery powered or hand crank radio, extra batteries, first aid kit, 7 day supply of medications, copies of personal and financial documents, emergency contact information, extra cash, maps, extra car and house keys. All age groups need to know what to do in an emergency. Prepare your children. It will take away some of the fear. Information is quickly disseminated through technology (smart phones). Hear a siren-initiate your plan of action.
