Regulations for Lent and the Easter Triduum

1. Lent is the principal season of penance in the Christian year. Priests, religious and laity are strongly urged to develop and follow a program of voluntary self-denial, attentiveness to prayer, and especially to works of charity and mercy.
2. Everyone of 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, February 18, and all the Fridays of Lent.
3. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 18, 2015 and Good Friday, April 3, 2015
4. On these two days of fast and abstinence, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
5. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is a serious matter.

NURSE'S CORNER: Recently in the news a lot has been discussed concerning the outbreak of measles and the advice to have children vaccinated. According to CDC, measles is a serious respiratory disease (in the lungs and breathing tubes) that causes a rash and fever. It is very contagious. In rare cases can be deadly. Measles starts with a fever that can get very high. Some of the other symptoms that may occur are:

- Cough, runny nose, red eyes
- Rash of tiny, red spots that start at the head and spread to the rest of the body
- Diarrhea
- Ear infection

Measles can be serious and dangerous, especially for babies and young children. From 2001-2013, 28% of children younger than 5 years old who had measles had to be treated in the hospital. It is advised that children should get the MMR shot that protects them against measles, mumps and rubella. The MMR shot is very safe and scientists have proven there is NO link between the shot and Autism. For information on when to vaccinate and other recommendations contact your doctor.
