Healthy New Year: As we start a new year, I thought it would be a good time to begin a bonus healthy lifestyle tip to each column. The new tip will be about healthier choices we all can make as we go about our daily lives. I will call them "Health Tip of the Week" or HTOTW for short. Some of the tips will be about changes. I realize change is not easy but trying is the first step. Some will be about reinforcing the healthy choices you have already started through your own resolutions. Make 2017 the year for your health.

This week's tip of the week (HTOTW): Make an appointment for a check-up or screening. Regular health exam and tests can find problems before they start. They also can help find problems early when your chances for treatment and cure are better.
