PARISH NURSE'S CORNER:

There is a risk associated with hot/humid conditions. Heat exhaustion or heat stroke can be life threatening. Know the symptoms:

Heat Exhaustion Symptoms:

- Often pale with cool, moist skin
- Sweating profusely
- Muscle cramps or pain
- Feels faint or dizzy
- May experience headache, weakness, thirst, nausea
- Elevated core (rectal) temp-usually more than 100 F
- Increased pulse

Heat Stroke symptoms:

- Unconscious or has a markedly abnormal mental status (dizziness, confusion, hallucinations or coma)
- Flushed, hot/dry skin (it may initially be moist from previous sweating)
- May have slightly elevated blood pressure at first that falls later
- May be hyperventilating
- Core (rectal) temp of 105 F or more

Home care is appropriate for mild forms of **heat exhaustion**. Rest in a cool shaded area; give *cool* fluids such as water/sport drinks. Salty snacks are appropriate as tolerated; loosen or remove clothing; apply cool water to skin; **do not use an alcohol rub; do not give any beverages containing alcohol or caffeine.**

Heat stroke is a medical emergency and an ambulance should be called immediately. Do not attempt to treat at home but you can help while waiting for medical assistance to arrive. Move the person to a cooler environment; alternately moisten the skin with *lukewarm* water and use a fan to blow cool air across the skin. Give *cool* water or sports drinks only if the person has normal mental state and can tolerate it. **No alcohol or caffeine.**

ADA Update

We now have pledges and contributions in the amount of **\$32,800 (97% of our \$33,894 goal) from 142 families (36% of our parish).**

Thank you to the 142 families who have pledged/contributed. **We ask the remaining 251 families to pray about making a donation.** If making a donation and contributing to the parish is a hardship, we ask that you give to the ADA first. We only have \$1094 to go to reach our goal. Anything over our goal comes back to the parish. We would like to get this wrapped up as soon as possible.
