PARISH NURSE'S CORNER

Now that summer is in full swing here in Illinois, there are a few common sense food safety tips to pass along as a reminder of the dangers of food poisoning from FoodSafety.gov

- Keep HOT foods hot and COLD foods cold! Cold foods should be chilled to 40* or below and hot foods heated to 140* or above. Bacteria can grow rapidly between 40 and 140 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Food should not sit at room temperature for more than two hours. One hour if the temp is over 90* degrees.
- Keep all raw meat wrapped separately
- Cook hamburger to at least 160 * and chicken and turkey to 180*
- Chill leftovers as soon as possible and reheat them to at least 165*
