The following is the translation of the prayer of consecration recited by Pope Francis in consecrating the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

Holy Mary, Virgin of Fatima,  
with renewed gratitude for your maternal presence  
We join our voice to that of all the generations  
Who call you blessed.  
We celebrate in you the works of God,  
Who never tires of looking down with mercy  
Upon humanity, afflicted with the wound of sin,  
To heal it and save it.  
Accept with the benevolence of a Mother  
The act of consecration that we perform today with confidence,  
Before this image of you that is so dear to us.  
We are certain that each of us is precious in your eyes  
And that nothing of all that lives in our hearts is unknown to you.  
We let ourselves be touched by your most sweet regard  
And we welcome the consoling caress of your smile.  
Hold our life in your arms;  
Bless and strengthen every desire for good;  
Revive and nourish faith;  
Sustain and enlighten hope;  
Awaken and animate charity;  
Guide all of us along the path of holiness.  
Teach us your own preferential love  
For the little and the poor,  
For the excluded and the suffering,  
For sinners and the downhearted;  
Bring everyone under your protection  
And entrust everyone to your beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus.

It's time we got down to some serious housekeeping. *Please*, before you leave Mass take a moment to straighten and clean up your area. Black folder to the back, Red book facing out and Mass music to the front. *Please*, do not use the book racks as the place to discard your tissues, etc. We need to be vigilant in keeping God's house clean and neat.

### ***NURSE'S CORNER:***

A review of what we should do when on medications. Above all they should be taken as prescribed. If you don't, you are hurting yourself. They are ordered for a specific condition.

**At the Pharmacy:** When you get a prescription filled, check the name on the bottle. Make sure it matches what your doctor ordered. Be sure your doctor knows of any over-the-counter medications you take to avoid any drug interactions.

**In the Hospital:** Get a list of all your medications, including any new ones. Speak up if something seems wrong. For instance, tell the nurse if you think you're about to get the wrong drug, you don't get your medication when you should or if you don't feel well afterward.

**At Home:** Read the instructions each time you take a medication. Check expiration dates regularly and properly dispose of drugs that have expired. To properly dispose of them, mix with used coffee grinds or kitty litter in a closed container and put into garbage. Don't stop taking any medication without discussing with your doctor. Some drugs need more time to work, even if you are feeling better. For some drugs decreasing the dosage, by the doctor, before quitting may be necessary.

Plan to give blood on Nov. 3rd. The Red Cross provides blood to our local VA Medical Center.
