NURSE'S CORNER:

With the change in the seasons and temperatures, colds and upper respiratory conditions are starting to raise their sickly heads. Please remember to take precautions. Wash your hands frequently; cover your mouth when you sneeze or couth; dispose of used tissues in proper receptacles; drink plenty of fluids. If you are sick, *stay home*, do not go out and pass your virus onto others. Some people have compromised resistance and can become very ill from catching a cold from someone. Fall allergies are a seasonal problem for many. Three main culprits are ragweed, mold, and dust mites. Symptoms vary. Over the counter medications can help relieve mild symptoms. More severe cases may need the attention of your physician who might want to prescribe a prescription medication or start "shots" for allergies.
