**Flu:** Flu can start in early October but mostly seen starting in November and staying all winter. It is important to get the flu shot early as it usually takes 2 weeks to become effective. The Health Department will be giving flu shots at the parish hall on October 7th. In addition to that time and your doctors office, you can get them at your local pharmacy. As a reminder, everyone needs a flu shot unless you have an allergy to the vaccine. Babies over 6 months and up. Check with your pediatrician. School age children are greatly encouraged as the bacteria is easily passed to one another and brought home to the adults. Adults are not immune to the flu, so seriously make plans to get one. People with debilitating conditions such as lung disease, heart disease and other severe problems need to take the vaccine as they are very susceptible. Flu can lead to death. Make plans today to get your shot. Thank you for taking care of yourself and thinking of others.
